Course Preview and Syllabi: DS & DA Programs Page

NetTutor Services: Brightspace

How long have you been a GA?

What are some pros and cons of being a GA?

Being a GA is certainly a time commitment, but it's incredibly rewarding! With over a decade of teaching experience, I naturally gravitate towards supporting students. However, serving as a GA has provided a uniquely fulfilling experience. I have the opportunity to collaborate with driven and like-minded peers, all working toward a common goal. Assisting students has developed my skills and introduced me to different approaches. It has also allowed me to explore content areas I never had the time to fully grasp before. I truly believe that my time as a GA has enhanced my skills and made me a more effective educator, reminding me of the importance of being a lifelong learner.

What's your academic and career background?

Initially, I taught Geometry and Algebra II, but now my courses include AP Statistics, AP Computer Science Principles, and an Engineering Design & Robotics course. My passion for data blossomed during my first year teaching AP Statistics, and that's when I discovered the MSDS program at Eastern. I'm incredibly grateful for this program and how it has ignited a new passion within me.

What is your favorite course in the program and why?

While I might be a bit biased, I have to say that 650 is my favorite! $^{\circ}$ I also thoroughly enjoyed the 660 SQL course, as well as the machine learning in 670. I'm looking forward to my final course, 680, as well. I've discovered that I particularly enjoy the upper-level courses that incorporate projects and more advanced assignments. - Each day, my time in the car is made enjoyable with the tunes of Elvis.




Accessing NetTutor


1. From the Brightspace homepage or the main page of a course, navigate to the "Academic Support" on the right side toolbar. Click NetTutor.






2. Choose "Tutoring Center" and "Computer Science and Data Science"






- 3. Explore your tutor options!
